Historical Note:

Beginning in the early 1800s, whale ships from Martha's Vineyard stopped at the Azorean and Cape Verde Islands for supplies and crew. Through these direct contacts, a number of Portuguese fishermen and whalers chose to settle on the Vineyard. As the immigrants became successful in their new home, they sent for family members and friends to join them. Additionally, these immigrants established contact with other Portuguese immigrant communities in the United States. For example, a regular packet service was begun between New Bedford and the Islands as more new comers and families came to Martha's Vineyard.

Among the earliest immigrants was Joseph Dias, he married Sarah Manter in 1781. So after his marriage, Dias was captured by British forces and died on a prison ship. Dias' marriage to the prominent Manter family began the Portuguese integration into the fabric of Vineyard life. For example, Joseph Dias' grand-son rose to the position of whaling master and his great-grandson became a Cottage City hotelier. Beyond the Dias family, there were many other Portuguese families that have contributed to the Island community. For example, Elmer DeLoura, son of another Azorean, left a \$2.3 million scholarship fund with income of over \$100,000 for the children of Martha's Vineyard. William Madison Wood, of the American Woolen Company, entrepreneur and philanthropist, was born in Edgartown. An important reference for individuals and families is Marianne Thomas' 2 volume *Our Portuguese Heritage: An Informal Genealogy of 3000 Families on Martha's Vineyard*.

Scope and Content:

This collection documents the arrival on the Vineyard of Portuguese immigrants, mainly from the Azorean Islands, beginning in the 1700's and their assimilation into Island life. It includes letters from the home Islands, legal papers, biographies and newspaper articles about the Portuguese on Martha's Vineyard, and genealogical research.
